CITY OF NEW ORLEANS

With more than 300,000 residents, it is the largest city in Louisiana and home to one of the world's largest and busiest ports. Since Hurricane Katrina in 2005, New Orleans has worked hard to rebuild its infrastructure and recover as a community. While the robust rebuilding effort has helped to

insulate the city from the economic downturn, many challenges remain for both the city and its police department.

NEW ORLEANS POLICE DEPARTMENT

The New Orleans Police Department has 1,850 full time employees serving a jurisdiction of 180 square miles. An additional preferred qualification is evidence of continuing training and self-development such as graduation from the FBI National Academy or other police leadership development program.

The successful candidate must have a minimum of 10 years' law enforcement experience at the command level, preferably in an urban environment and must demonstrate compelling results in the reduction of violent crime.
