

Hooky-Playing 10th Grader Admits Slaying Deputy Hurt; Last **Rites for Officer Held** Today

A 17-year-old Negro high school student is in the parish jail today on murder charges after he admitted yesterday that he fatally shot Deputy Charles H. Hurt, who found him playing hooky Wednesday

Henry "Wolf Man" Montgomery, 7305 Hooper Road, a 10th grade Scotlandville High School student, was booked on the murder charge in the death of the 40-year-old parish deputy sheriff and father of three.

Montgomery appeared this morning in district criminal court, where Judge Jess Johnson appointed local Negro attorneys Johnny Jones and Murphy Bell as defense counsel. Meanwhile, funeral services

for Hurt were held at the Welsh Funeral home at 10 a.m. to-day, with burial following in Resthaven Gardens of Memory. Hurt resided at 247 W. Magnolia Drive in Baker.



### C. E. Fenner **Dies Thursday** In New Orleans

SLIDELL (AP)—Charles E. Fenner, one of the cofound-ers of the brokerage firm which later became Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner and Smith, died unexpectedly at his country home here late Thursday night. Fenner, a noted New Orleans civic and business leader for decades, was 87.
