Thank you for reaching out to me today in reference to Lycée's leadership plans. I am honored and excited about the opportunity to meet with the committee and discuss my credentials as well as my thoughts on what Lycée needs as far as leadership and a smooth transition to the next academic year. As I told you during our phone conversation, I will be leaving the country on June 6, but I am committed to return earlier than scheduled should I be selected for the position. This is the body of the letter of interest I previously sent:

I have 20 years of educational experience in Orleans Parish public schools and Orleans Parish charter schools. Ten of these years were spent at Audubon Montessori /L'École Franco Américaine and Audubon Charter. At Audubon, I taught all core academic subjects in grades 4, 5 and 6, as well as English Language Arts in grades 7 and 8. I worked very closely with the French teachers and the French Director, and played a critical role in developing strategies to maximize success of both French and Montessori students, including raising scores on standardized tests (including LEAP and IOWA), and fortifying the French curriculum to better prepare French students and ensure success in such tests. In particular, I have done curriculum development work with Marie Claude Kellerman, who at that time served as Director of the French School, where the French and the Louisiana curricula were analyzed in detail in order to find innovative ways to prepare students for the challenges of standardized testing without compromising the French curriculum, an experience that proved very rewarding for me, but most importantly for students.
